


You might have seen my memo last week about **Dr. Michael Paine's** decision to step down as the director of our master's and PhD programs in craniofacial biology after 14 years at the helm. Words cannot express how grateful we are to Dr. Paine for his hard work, steady leadership and many contributions that have led the program to become one of the nation's most preeminent. While Dr. Paine plans to turn his focus to research and teaching at Ostrow, **Dr. Jianfu "Jeff" Chen** will take the program's reins, effective July 1. Dr. Chen, who joined Ostrow in 2017, is widely recognized as a leading authority on fetal neurologic consequences of maternal Zika infection and other systemic diseases, and is also known for his ability to collaborate with other scientists by working at the intersection of scientific disciplines. I am confident that under his leadership, we are in incredibly capable hands. Thank you, Dr. Paine for your leadership throughout the years, and congratulations to Dr. Chen on the new appointment.


We were very excited to find out recently that our very own **Dr. Amy Merrill-Brugger** received a 5-year National Institute of Dental and Craniofacial Research (NIDCR) grant to support her study, titled "Developmental regulation of tendon-bone connectivity in the jaw." The study's goal is to identify how tendon-bone attachments form in the developing jaw, a process that currently is not well-understood. Information gained from this study could guide future developmentally inspired strategies to promote tendon-bone attachment repair in those with temporomandibular joint disorders. As we've announced before, we are currently the No. 4 funded

dental institution in the nation by the NIDCR, truly symbolizing the trust that this federal agency has in researchers, like Dr. Merrill-Brugger. We are incredibly proud of all the discoveries that our scientific investigators continue to provide our profession, constantly pushing dentistry into new, unexpected directions.


WELCOME ADVANCED EDUCATION RESIDENTS!









