

Two weeks ago, we held our annual Board of Councilors (BOC) retreat (which we skipped last year due to the pandemic). It was really refreshing to spend time with so many of our board members — not only catching up with them on their lives, but also getting to hear their ideas and advice as we move beyond the pandemic. In addition to updates for our Board provided by **Dr. Mahvash Navazesh** and **Dr. Yang Chai**, we were joined by a mindfulness expert as well as **Dr. Marko Vujicic**, who is the American Dental Association's Chief Economist and the Vice President of the ADA's Health Policy Institute. Dr. Vujicic gave a very interesting presentation about four big trends facing dentistry (in 5 years, 10 years and even 20 years from now), including intensified consumerism, shifting demographics within the dental workforce, emerging technology and payment reform. It was truly an inspiring presentation. Immediate Past President of the BOC **Dr. Ralph Allman**

delivered a presentation about the utilization of evolving technologies in the orthodontic module for our DDS and ASPID students. Additionally, we held a panel discussion, featuring **Ms. Anna Adjei** and **Ms. Taylor Purks**, regarding improving Ostrow's diversity efforts and how diversity played a role in their choosing Ostrow.

I would like to thank BOC President **Dr. Carol Gomez Summerhays** for setting the retreat agenda and overseeing the event. Her vast experience and knowledge as a global leader in organized dentistry are such an asset to our school.
