

We learned recently that the University has renewed its decision this year to require influenza vaccines for all USC students, faculty and staff. The decision is meant to lessen the likelihood of a "twindemic," with both influenza and COVID-19 cases raging simultaneously. You must upload either flu vaccination proof or a medical/religious/philosophical exemption request to your MySHR by no later than November 1. Note: If you receive your flu vaccine at any of the USC Pharmacy locations, your documentation will be automatically uploaded to

your MySHR within 72 hours. If you don't take appropriate action, it could hinder your ability to access campus — including the Norris Dental Science Center. As with all of the other vaccinations or exemption requests, the information will be included on your USC Trojan Check app, granting (or denying) you access to campus.

This past weekend, I was honored to take part in an incredibly productive Century Club Alumni Association (CCAA) retreat where the CCAA executive board and I reviewed our membership model, and set goals for the next fiscal year. Most excitingly, the board voted to update the group's mission statement to include our dedication to issues of diversity, equity and inclusion. I'd like to thank the entire executive board for their time, dedication and loyalty to the school; Ms. Joan Beleno Sanchez for her steady hand as the CCAA President; and Dr. Christopher Acone, who has been leading the charge in codifying our diversity efforts into the group's mission statement.
