

# **DEAN'S MESSAGE**

## Dear USC Dentistry Community:

As March arrives, it seems spring has officially sprung over the Norris Dental Science Center, with so much activity.

Earlier this week, we received some very exciting news. Ostrow's own Associate Dean of Research **Yang Chai** has been named a National Academy

of Inventors (NAI) senior member, joining 10 others here at USC to comprise this year's incoming class of inventors. The senior membership is meant to recognize remarkable innovation producing technologies that have brought — or aspire to bring — real impact to society at large. Citing Chai's lifelong scientific inquiry into the molecular and cellular mechanisms behind congenital birth defects, the NAI acknowledged Chai's work developing 3-D printed scaffolds seeded with stem cells to regenerate craniofacial and dental tissue for patients as one of the projects earning him this accolade. As far as we can tell, Chai is the first Ostrow faculty member in history to earn such a distinction. This follows on the heels of his being elected to the National Academy of Medicine in 2018. The grant, called the Dental Faculty Loan Repayment Program, is awarded to one or more full-time faculty members (U.S. citizens or permanent residents with a valid work permit and California dental license), who have both a history of working in dental public health and pediatric dentistry as well as a current focus on dental public health and pediatric instruction. The HRSA grant process is incredibly selective, with only a handful of schools receiving the funds nationwide.
