


DEAN'S MESSAGE

In early March, Ostrow students, faculty and staff attended the 2024 annual American Dental Education Association (ADEA) Session and Exhibition in New Orleans. Our **Office of Admissions** was present to answer prospective students' questions, and community members were honored with awards. **George Parisis** DDS '24 was recognized as one of three winners of the Power

of a Smile Colgate Award for his winning case study. This is the first time someone has earned this award from Ostrow. The award was given for having the most complete dental evaluation; risk assessments; and treatment plan including preventive treatments, oral care recommendations, cultural and socioeconomic considerations and patient outcomes. Haeseong Lee DDS '25 also earned accolades for his research poster, titled "Vibrational Biofeedback Splint Therapy for Sleep Bruxism: A Meta-Analysis," exploring vibrational feedback splint therapy to reduce the duration and frequency of sleep bruxism episodes. Mentored by faculty members Mariela Padilla and Parish **Sedghizadeh**, Haeseong was one of six individuals to present their research at the Student Competition for Advancing Dental Research and Its Application. Finally, **Corey Berry** — who co-presented a session titled "ADEA CAAPID: Hot Topics for International Dental Programs" — was elected secretary for the ADEA Section-Dental School Admissions Office and Student Affairs/Financial Aid Members. Congratulations Corey, and thank you to all who attended for making us look so good!
